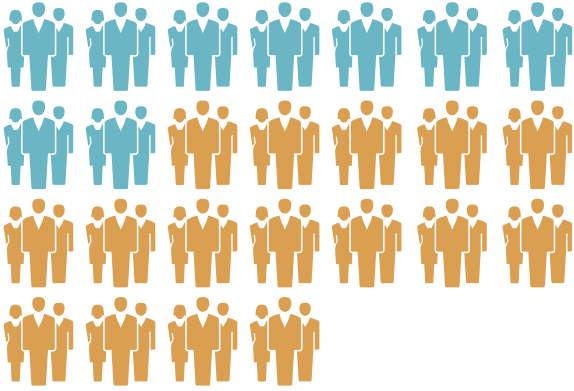


Snapshot: New York City Unemployment

250,000



= Short-term unemployed and actively looking for a job for six months or less (160,000)

= Long-term unemployed and actively looking for a job for six months or more (90,000)

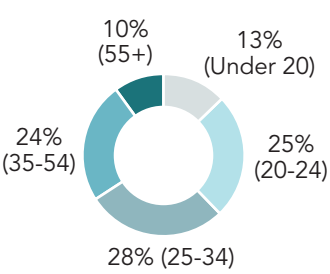
NYC currently has **250,000** residents who are unemployed and actively looking for work. More than one-third of these unemployed residents have been out of work for over six months.

55% have no academic accreditation higher than a high school degree or GED, **11%** do not speak English well, or at all, and **78%** belong to a racial or ethnic minority.

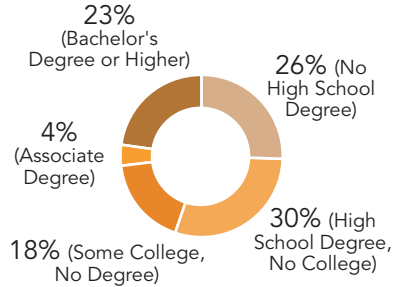
An additional **32,000** “discouraged workers” were formerly employed but have stopped actively looking for a new job.

All told, just **70%** of the city’s working-age population is currently employed or looking for work, well below London’s rate of 77%.

Short-Term Unemployed



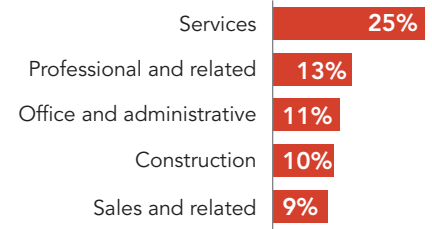
Age



Educational Attainment

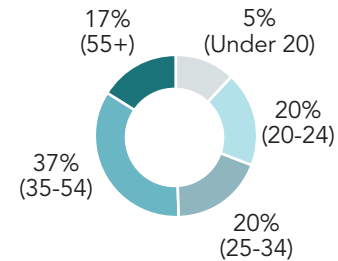


Top 5 Industries

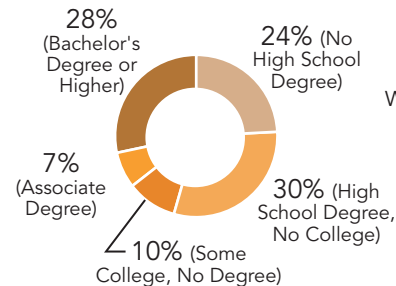


Top 5 Occupations

Long-Term Unemployed



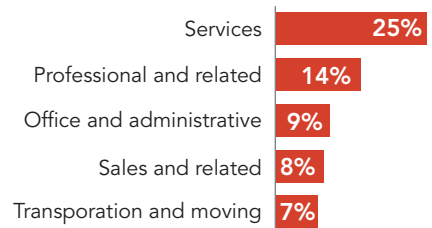
